## Chapter 5 Problem 22 <sup>†</sup>

Given

$$\vec{F}_{1} = \frac{75.0}{\sqrt{2}} (\hat{i} - \hat{j}) N$$

$$\vec{F}_{2} = \frac{150.0}{\sqrt{2}} (\hat{i} - \hat{j}) N$$

## Solution

Find the third force that is needed to balance the first two forces.

The sum of all three forces should add up to zero.

$$\vec{F_1} + \vec{F_2} + \vec{F_3} = 0$$

Solving for the third force gives

$$\vec{F}_3 = -\vec{F}_1 - \vec{F}_2$$

Substituting in the provided values gives

$$\vec{F}_3 = -\left(\frac{75.0}{\sqrt{2}}(\hat{i} - \hat{j})\right) N - \left(\frac{150.0}{\sqrt{2}}(\hat{i} - \hat{j})\right) N$$

$$\vec{F}_3 = \left\{-\frac{75.0}{\sqrt{2}}\hat{i} + \frac{75.0}{\sqrt{2}}\hat{j} - \frac{150.0}{\sqrt{2}}\hat{i} + \frac{150.0}{\sqrt{2}}\hat{j}\right\} N$$

$$\vec{F}_3 = \left\{-\frac{225.0}{\sqrt{2}}\hat{i} + \frac{225.0}{\sqrt{2}}\hat{j}\right\} N$$

$$\vec{F}_3 = \left\{-159\hat{i} + 159\hat{j}\right\} N$$
